Most scholarship search services require you to fill out a personal profile listing your individual characteristics and accomplishments. The program then combs the database of scholarships to find those that you may be eligible for, according to the information that you gave in the profile. Again, you should *never* have to pay to use a scholarship search service. **Any** of the factors could qualify you for a scholarship, so be sure to complete **all** information in the profile

What Makes A Good Scholarship Essay?

When applying for scholarships to help with your college educational expenses, a good essay is an extremely important part of your application. Most applicants can boast of memberships in clubs and sports but the essay is one place where you can set yourself apart from other students.

A good essay should:

- Be typewritten and neatly printed
- Approximately one page in length (4-5 paragraphs)
- Explain why you believe you are the best candidate for this particular scholarship
- Give specific information into why you are pursuing your major
- Be explicit why you chose your college
- Give the scholarship committee insight into your personality, interests, motivations and goals
- Tell of significant people or events in your life that have helped shape your interests, attitudes, goals, etc.
- Give an explanation of special circumstances you feel would be important for the scholarship committee to know when reviewing your application.
- Demonstrate that you have put as much effort into the writing of your essay as you would expect the scholarship committee to put into reviewing your application
- Proofread, proofread, and proofread! (absolutely no mistakes)
